## *Background:*

- The Canadian Association for Astrological Education (C.A.A.E) is a non-profit organization incorporated in 1993.
- The aim of the organization is to promote a formal approach to the teaching and study of astrology.
- Study Guides for students, and course curricula for astrology teachers, have been developed.
- A student teacher training program is also in place.
- Courses are currently being offered in Toronto, Guelph, Peterborough, Oshawa ON, Calgary AB, Fort Langley BC, Winnipeg, MN.
- To date over 500 Examination Certificates or Course Completion Certificates have been awarded
- Examinations are held twice yearly in May and November
- In some circumstances, an evaluation for equivalency may be used for certification.

# C.A.A.E Examination Courses *Certificate Level*

The series of Examination Courses provide a thorough knowledge of the basics of Astrological lore. They are as follows:

## **Basic Astrology - Level 1**

*Prerequisite:* none

This course consists of three semesters lasting approximately 60 hours, including both classroom & personal study. This includes an introduction to the language of Astrology; signs; planets; houses; aspects and basic delineation. Personal and other charts are used as learning tools. There are mandatory textbooks & recommended reading lists.

A **Level I** Certificate is awarded by C.A.A.E to those who attain a 70% or better grade in a 3-hour examination.

## **Intermediate Astrology - Level II**

*Prerequisite:* Level I Certification

This course consists of three semesters lasting approximately 60 hours, including both classroom & personal study. This includes describing chart patterns, configurations, retrogrades, interceptions, moon phases & nodes, minor aspects, etc. Emphasis placed on chart overviews as a means of determining important features in any chart. Intermediate delineation builds up to the final spring semester of chart synthesis. There are mandatory textbooks & recommended reading lists.

A **Level II** Certificate is awarded by C.A.A.E to those who attain a 70% or better grade in a 6-hour examination.

## **Advanced Astrology - Level III**

*Prerequisite:* Level II Certification

This course consists of three semesters lasting approximately 60 hours, including both classroom & personal study. This includes trending tools -- the first semester devoted to planetary cycles & transits, followed by progressions; solar arcs; solar, lunar, and planetary returns. The second & third semesters include the 'hands-on' use of all predictive tools. There are mandatory textbooks & recommended reading lists.

**Level III** Certificate is awarded by C.A.A.E to those who attain a 70% or better grade in a 6-hour examination

## The Math Certificate

*Prerequisite:* none

This course teaches the mathematical skills required to construct a natal chart. Starting with the location, time and date of birth, the student uses the ephemeris, table of houses, atlases & scientific calculator, to create a natal chart. Training provided in the calculation of the ACD, the Part of Fortune, Midpoints and the Vertex. Some instruction in basic astronomy is included.

A **Mathematics** Certificate is awarded by C.A.A.E to those who attain a 70% or better grade in a 3-hour examination

# C.A.A.E Diploma Level

*Prerequisites:* All CAAE Examination Certificate Level Courses

Five specific areas of study in the diploma level are required to be a fully proficient astrologer. These are necessary for the astrologer who wishes to work as a counselling astrologer or teacher of astrology, and provides the basis for other branches of astrology.

### Courses:

Astrological Counselling  
Astrology of Relationships  
Horary Astrology  
Rectification  
Vocational Astrology

On completion of the specific areas of study and to receive the **Diploma of Excellence**, the C.A.A.E examination committee will evaluate at least one taped client Chart reading.

## Astrological Counselling

A minimum of 24 hours classroom, and a further 20 hours, of personal study over an approximately six week time frame.

The overall goal is to produce excellent astrological counselors through a comprehensive program. Topics included are counselling skills; listening & communication; ethics; overview of psychology & psychiatry. There will be an emphasis on sharing, role-playing and case discussion. There is an extensive suggested reference & reading list.

**Astrological Counselling** Certificate is awarded by C.A.A.E to those who attain a 70% (C+) or better grade in a written assignment; or equivalency.

## Astrology of Relationships

A minimum of 40 hours classroom, and a further 20 hours, of personal study over an approximately six week time frame. The overall goal is to identify the potential for relationship in a natal chart and develop skills to assess relationship potential between romantic couples, friendships, business colleagues, parent/child, etc.

The first part concentrates on assessment and analysis of Natal mythology. The second part deals with Synastry and composite charts.

**Astrology of Relationships** Certificate is awarded by C.A.A.E to those who attain a 70% (C+) or better grade in two written assignments, or equivalency.

## Horary Astrology

A minimum of 40 hours class instruction & approximately 30 hours of personal study using a well-defined series of questions to assist in answering specific questions with complete answers.

This course is based on William Lilly's rules of horary analysis. The only mandatory reading material is the Horary Handbook

**Horary** Certificate is awarded by C.A.A.E to those who attain a 70% (C+) or better grade in written assignments, or equivalency.

## Rectification

This course is still under design with anticipated offering in early 2006

## Vocational Astrology

A minimum of 34 hours classroom, and a further 20 hours, of personal study over an approximately six week time frame..

The overall goal is to provide the skills required to for analyzing and identifying the most appropriate occupation or profession. Understanding the differences between vocation and job; how each house has an impact; the influence of the elements, including synchronicity of the elements and houses; impact of the Gauquelin sectors; chart patterns. There is a suggested reading list.

**Vocational Astrology** Certificate is awarded by C.A.A.E to those who attain a 70% (C+) or better grade in two written assignments, or equivalency.

### Teacher training

*Prerequisite:* Level II Certification

Training offered in the classroom setting for 20 weeks, under the supervision of a qualified instructor. The teacher-in-training benefits from one-to-one instruction and constructive criticism. The material includes preliminary theory and student presentations with prepared handouts.

**Instruction** Certificate is awarded by C.A.A.E on successful completion of at least six presentations.

### Membership in C.A.A.E

C.A.A.E. offers two types of membership:

- **Student** or **Associate**.

A **student** member is usually taking one or more of the C.A.A.E. course offerings.

The fee for a **student** membership is \$10.00\* annually.

An **associate** is usually a member who has a working knowledge of astrology and typically has completed the **Level II** training in the C.A.A.E. education programme.  
N.B. Must include a brief resume of astrological background.

The fee for an **associate** membership is \$40.00\* annually.
